Write an explanation and a result for each topic sentence for can use the words/phrases given or your own

1st main-body paragraph

- A. Topic sentence: Teenagers who study at home will miss the lively atmosphere of the classroom.
- B. Explanation: (they are likely get bored gradually lose - motivation - for learning) They are likely to get bored and gradually lose their motivation for learning.
- C. Result: (there is a risk be stuck same level long period of time - academic scores - suffer) There is a risk that they will be stuck at the same level for a long period of time and their academic scores will suffer.

2nd main-body paragraph

- A. Topic sentence: Allowing these particular students to do online classes instead of attending regular school goes completely against one of the primary aims of education, which is helping students develop social skills.
- B. Explanation: (even if students able work in groups online - nothing can replace - benefits - face-to-face communication - peers) Even if students are able to work in groups online, nothing can replace the benefits of face-to-face communication with their peers.
- C. Result: (e-learning cause loneliness social isolation which - eventually - lead to - health issues - depression) E-learning can cause loneliness and social isolation, which may eventually lead to serious health issues, like depression.
