**2.84 appreciate (v)**  
realize sth has value  
εκτιμώ  
I **appreciate** your help with these heavy bags that I can't possibly carry.  
• appreciation (n)

**2.85 greet (v)**  
say hello or welcome sb  
χαιρετώ  
I **greeted** everyone as they arrived at the party.  
• greeting (n)

**2.86 salute (v)**  
greet with a formal sign, e.g. like a soldier  
χαιρετώ (στρατιωτικά), παρουσιάζομαι  
The soldier stood to attention and **saluted** his superior officer.  
• salute (n)

**2.87 welcome (v)**  
say hello in a friendly way  
υποδέχομαι  
The teacher asked us to **welcome** the new student to the class.  
• welcome (n)

**2.88 conduct (v)**  
behave in a certain way  
συμπεριφέρομαι όπως πρέπει  
The soccer fans **conducted** themselves well and there was no trouble at the match.  
• conduct (n)

**2.89 regard (v)**  
look at in a certain way  
θεωρώ, σκέφτομαι  
She **regards** travel as a way to enhance her knowledge of the world.  
• regard (n)

**2.90 treat (v)**  
behave to sb in a certain way  
συμπεριφέρομαι  
The school bully **treats** all the little kids badly.  
• treatment (n)

**2.91 tone (n)**  
sound quality  
τόνος  
She spoke to me in an angry **tone** of voice.

**2.92 absolutely (adv)**  
totally  
εντελώς  
Are you **absolutely** sure you left the keys by the desk?  
• absolute (adj)

**2.93 efficiently (adv)**  
which works well and has results  
αποτελεσματικά  
The trains on this line work **efficiently** and never late.  
• efficiency (n), efficient (adj)

**2.94 lose one's temper (phr)**  
get angry  
χάνω την ψυχραιμία μου  
Dad **lost his temper** when I told him I dated

**2.95 break up (phr v)**  
separate  
χωρίζω  
My sister **broke up** with her boyfriend and been crying in her room all day.  
• break-up (n)

**2.96 fall out (phr v)**  
stop being friends  
τσακώνομαι  
Jane and Tina **fell out** last week and they spoken since.

**2.97 get over (phr v)**  
recover from  
ξεπερνώ, συνέρχομαι  
It took Paul a long time to **get over** the shock his dog died.

**2.98 line (n)**  
people one behind the other or next to other  
σειρά  
We waited in **line** for ages at the supermarket because it was so crowded.

2.99 **queue** (n)

people in a line  
ουρά (με ανθρώπους)

*There was a long **queue** at the hot dog stand so we decided not to wait.*

• queue (v)

2.100 **row** (n)

things in a line, e.g. seats  
σειρά (καθισμάτων)

*We sat in the second **row** at the movies.*

2.101 **willpower** (n)

self discipline  
θέληση, αυτοκυριαρχία

*He will never lose weight because he doesn't have the **willpower** to diet.*

2.102 **edition** (n)

copy of a magazine or newspaper  
έκδοση

*The January **edition** of my woman's magazine has an article on self-esteem.*

2.103 **print** (n)

the process of making a book or newspaper  
εκτύπωση

*The editor prepared the newspaper for **print**.*

• print (v)

2.104 **capability** (n)

ability  
ικανότητα

*He shows great **capability** in science and does well in all his assignments.*

• capable (adj)

2.105 **contain** (v)

have sth inside  
περιέχω

*This album **contains** all our family photos.*

• container (n)

2.106 **cover** (v)

protect  
καλύπτω

*We **cover** our garden furniture to protect it during the winter.*

• cover (n)

2.107 **comprise** (v)

be made of certain parts

αποτελούμαι

*This course is **comprised** of six sessions.*

2.108 **include** (v)

contain

περιλαμβάνω

*Use of the phone is not **included** in the price of the room, so you will be charged extra.*

• inclusion (n), inclusive (adj)

2.109 **involved** (adj)

be part of

εμπλεκόμενος

*Two men **involved** in the robbery are wanted by the police.*

• involve (v), involvement (n)

2.110 **acquire** (v)

get

αποκτώ

*He **acquired** a liking for pasta while in Italy.*

2.111 **approach** (v)

go closer to

προσεγγίζω, πλησιάζω

*The man crossed the street and **approached** the police officer to ask for directions.*

• approach (n)

2.112 **assume** (v)

believe without proof

υποθέτω

*Mom **assumed** I would be home late, but she was wrong.*

• assumption (n)

2.113 **access** (v)

enter

έχω πρόσβαση

*I usually **access** my bank account online using my cell phone.*

• access (n)



## 2.218 stress (v)

emphasize

δίνω έμφαση, τονίζω

I must **stress** that cheating during the test will be penalized.

• stress (n)

## 2.219 adapt (v)

change to a new situation

προσαρμόζομαι, εξοικειώνομαι

When we moved house it took us a while to **adapt** to the new place.

• adaptable (adj)

## 2.220 set a date (phr)

book when sth will happen

ορίζω ημερομηνία

Did they **set a date** for the wedding yet?

## 2.225 be fed up with (phr)

be tired of sth

είμαι αγανακτισμένος, έχω βαρεθεί, μπούχτισα

He is **fed up with** phoning her and never getting an answer.

## 2.226 scan (v)

look through quickly

ρίχνω μια γρήγορη ματιά

I **scanned** the article for my name.

• scan (n)

## 2.227 browse (v)

look through in a relaxed way

χαζεύω, περιεργάζομαι

We **browsed** around the store for half an hour, but didn't buy anything.

## 2.228 glance (v)

look at sth/sb very quickly and then look away

κοιτάζω πολύ γρήγορα, ρίχνω κλεφτή ματιά

The driver **glanced** in his mirror at the traffic behind him.

• glance (n)

## 2.229 deliberate (adj)

done on purpose

σκοπίμος

His **deliberate** attempt to upset her was definitely not a mistake.

## 2.230 decent (adj)

having high standards

αξιοπρεπής, ικανοποιητικός

She is a **decent** person who is honest and kind to everyone.

• decency (n)

## 2.231 generous (adj)

giving more than expected

γενναιόδωρος

Mom was very **generous** when she gave me all this money to spend.

• generosity (n)

## 2.221 voice (v)

say, express

εκφράζω

He **voiced** his opinion in an interview on the news.

• voice (n, adj)

## 2.222 stuffy (adj)

with no fresh air

αποπνικτικός

This room is **stuffy** as it was closed all week while I was on vacation.

## 2.223 influence (n)

effect on sb/sth

επιρροή, επίδραση

He had a bad **influence** on his friends and got them into trouble.

• influence (v), influential (adj)

## 24 Impressionist (n)

artist who painted in a style giving an impression of a scene rather than exact detail

Ιμπρεσιονιστής

Monet was a famous **Impressionist** who painted many scenes of London.

## 2.232 cheer (v)

shout to encourage sb

επευφημώ

The crowd **cheered** when a goal was scored.

• cheer (n)

## 2.233 celebrate (v)

do sth special for an event

γιορτάζω

I want to **celebrate** my birthday at a restaurant.

• celebration (n)

## 2.234 portion (n)

amount of food

μερίδα

He ate a large **portion** of food because he was starving.

## 2.235 bill (n)

paper stating how much you must pay

λογαριασμός

The hotel **bill** included breakfast and dinner.

• bill (v)

## 2.236 sum (n)

amount of money

ποσό

I think \$1000 is a large **sum** for this sofa.

## 2.237 withdraw (v)

take money out of a bank account

κάνω ανάληψη, αποσύρω

He **withdrew** \$50 from his bank account so he has only \$200 left.

• withdrawal (n), deposit (ant)

## 2.238 credit (n)

amount of money added to a bank account

πίστωση

My bonus showed as **credit** on my bank statement.

• credit (v)

## 2.239 expense (n)

money spent

έξοδο

My vacation was a large **expense** so there is not much money in my account.

• expensive (adj)

## 2.240 delay (v)

be late

καθυστερώ

The heavy traffic **delayed** us and we arrived at the theater late.

• delay (n)

## 2.241 postpone (v)

arrange for a later time

αναβάλλω

The director **postponed** the meeting for tomorrow as he was urgently called away.

## 2.242 persuade (v)

make sb do sth by giving them good reasons

do it

πείθω

She **persuaded** me to come to the movies by promising to pay for my ticket.

• persuasion (n), persuasive (adj)

## 2.243 address (v)

talk to formally

απευθύνομαι

The manager **addressed** all his employees and made a speech about new company policies.

## 2.244 admit (v)

say you did sth

παραδέχομαι, ομολογώ

Stan **admitted** that he could not pay back the money he owed me.

• admission (n)

## 2.245 savor (v)

enjoy

απολαμβάνω

He **savored** the moment when he got his prize.

## 2.246 disapprove (v)

believe sth is wrong

αποδοκιμάζω

I **disapprove** of staying out late on a school night when you should be studying.

• disapproval (n), approve (ant)



**2.247 aware** (adj)  
knowing about  
ενήμερος, γνώστης  
He was **not aware** of the amount of homework I had and came round to see me.  
• awareness (n)

**2.248 devoted** (adj)  
loving and loyal  
αφοσιωμένος  
The **devoted** mother carefully cared for her baby.  
• devote (v), devotion (n)

**2.249 recollected** (adj)  
remembered, recalled  
που αναπολείται / ανακαλείται στη μνήμη  
These are the **recollected** stories of war time heroes.  
• recollect (v), recollection (n)

**2.250 not bother** (v)  
not do sth  
δεν ασχολούμαι  
He **did not bother** watching the movie because he had seen it before.

**2.251 worry** (v)  
keep thinking about problems  
ανησυχώ  
He **worried** about his lost dog.  
• worry (n), worried (adj)

**2.252 careless** (adj)  
not thinking about what you do  
απόσεκτος  
It was **careless** of you to break the glass.  
• careful (ant)

**2.253 casual** (adj)  
not formal, relaxed  
πρόχειρος  
He wears **casual** clothes on the weekend like jeans and a sweater.  
• casually (adv)

**2.254 confess** (v)  
say you did sth, usually sth bad  
ομολογώ  
The thief **confessed** to stealing the money.  
• confession (n)

**2.255 display** (v)  
show  
επιδεικνύω  
The firefighter **displayed** great courage when he saved the child from the fire.  
• display (n)

**2.256 conditions** (n)  
working situations  
συνθήκες  
The **conditions** in the cold and wet factory were terrible for the employees.

**2.257 settings** (n)  
controls  
ρυθμίσεις  
The TV **settings** can be changed with this button here on the remote control.

**2.258 commit** (v)  
do sth bad, e.g. a crime  
διαπράττω  
The man **committed** three burglaries before he got caught.

**2.259 convert** (v)  
change  
τροποποιώ, μετατρέπω  
We want to **convert** the bathroom to a shower room.  
• conversion (n)

**2.260 convince** (v)  
make sb want to do sth  
πείθω  
Mom and dad **convinced** me to study medicine with their good opinions of doctors.  
• convincing (adj)

**2.261 determined** (adj)  
having made a firm decision to do sth  
αποφασισμένος  
He was **determined** to get his driving license and so had lessons every day.  
• determination (n)
