be wrong

κάνω λάθος

*He seemed to **be mistaken** about what time the show started and got there an hour early.***1.102 recall** (v)

remember, bring back to memory

θυμάμαι, ανακαλώ

*Can you **recall** the name of the hotel we stayed at in New York?***READING: VOCABULARY. Questions 61-74****1.103 drop sb off** (phr v)

take sb somewhere in your car

μεταφέρω κπ με το αυτοκίνητο

*Mom always **drops us off** at school and then drives to work.***1.104 go off** (phr v)

become bad

γραφική ύλη

*If you need a red pen, there is some **stationery** in the top drawer of my desk.***1.108 goods** (n)

things that can be sold

προϊόντα, αγαθά

*This store sells shoes and other leather **goods**.***1.109 provisions** (n)

food

προμήθειες, τρόφιμα

*They bought lots of **provisions** from the supermarket for the dinner party.***1.110 supplies** (n)

large quantities of equipment

προμήθειες, εξοπλισμός

*We must order more stationery **supplies** for the office for the whole year.*

things used for a particular job

εξοπλισμός

*I want to get some computer **equipment** for my new laptop, like a mouse and a memory stick.*

ask for sth in a strong way

απαιτώ, ζητώ

*The workers **demand**ed a pay increase from the management.*

• demand (n)

1.113 insist (v)

keep saying that sth must be done

επιμένω

*Sue **insisted** on washing the dishes and told her grandma to rest.*

tell sb to do sth

διατάζω, παραγγέλνω

*The army officer **ordered** the soldiers to stand up straight.*

This ancient vase **is worth** an absolute fortune.

αντιμετωπίζω, αντικρίζω
He couldn't **face** his family after he failed all his exams.

- 1.122 nerves (n)**
stress
νεύρα, στρες
He was overcome by **nerves** before his test.
• nervous (adj)
- 1.123 trouble (n)**
problems
πρόβλημα, μπελάς
He had some **trouble** with his neighbors because they were making a lot of noise at night.

- 1.124 upset (n)**
unhappiness
ταραχή, αναστάτωση
She had an emotional **upset** when she lost her and was miserable for a long time.

- 1.125 gifted (adj)**
naturally talented
ταλαντούχος, προικισμένος
Kate's son is very **gifted** and has been playing violin since he was six.
• gift (n)
- 1.126 skilled (adj)**
specialized through learning
ικανός, έμπειρος
The dentist was very **skilled** and did lovely work on her teeth.
• skill (n)
- 1.127 qualified (adj)**
having appropriate knowledge and skills
που έχει τα κατάλληλα προσόντα, διπλωματούχος
Jack is a **qualified** lawyer now that he passed university exams.

be prepared physically

Trained athletes have to run many miles every day.

no jobs available for people who want work

level

αναλογία, ποσοστό

*The unemployment **rate** rose to 25%.*

evidence

απόδειξη

*His DNA at the scene of the crime is **proof** that he was there.*

• prove (v)

1.133 **record** (n)

written information

αρχείο

*The doctor keeps a **record** of all his patients' health details.*

• record (v)

1.134 **register** (n)

list, system of keeping records

μητρώο

*The teacher looked at the class **register** to see who was missing.*

• register (v)

1.135 **trace** (n)

very small amount

ίχνος

*This candy might contain a **trace** of peanuts, so be careful if you have allergies.*

1.136 **proposal** (n)

suggestion

πρόταση, εισήγηση

*He made a **proposal** for the new commercial that was accepted by the manager.*

• propose (v)

1.137 **retrench** (v)

spend less money

κάνω περικοπές

*The government was forced to **retrench** to save money.*

1.138 **recount** (v)

tell, describe

αφηγούμαι, εξιστορώ

*She **recounted** the events that led up to her meeting her partner.*

1.139 **reduce** (v)

make less

μειώνω

*Costs were **reduced** at the company by paying people less.*

• reduction (n)

1.140 **reject** (v)

not accept

απορρίπτω

*His proposal was too expensive so the boss **rejected** it and asked for a new one.*

• rejection (n)

1.141 **attend** (v)

go to, be present at

παρακολουθώ, παρίσταμαι

*I have to **attend** a seminar so I won't be at work tomorrow.*

• attendance (n)

1.142 **commonly** (adv)

often

συχνά

*The panda is **commonly** used as an example of an endangered animal.*

• common (adj)

1.143 **habitually** (adv)

usually

συνήθως

*He **habitually** wakes up in a bad mood.*

• habit (n), habitual (adj)

1.144 regularly (adv)

often and at the same time

τακτικά

We meet **regularly** on Mondays for a drink with our friends.

• regularity (n), regular (adj)

1.145 repeatedly (adv)

all the time

επανελημμένα

I **repeatedly** ask my neighbor to be quiet but he never listens.

• repetition (n), repeated (adj)

1.146 wave (v)

greet with your hand

γνέφω

Betty **waved** at me from across the street.

• wave (n)

1.147 slide (v)

move smoothly

γλιστρώ

He **slid** into the seat quietly because he was late to the meeting.

turn over and over

κυλάω, τσουλάω

The ball **rolled** down the street.

1.149 exploration (n)

travels to learn about the world

εξερεύνηση

Scientists are interested in the **exploration** of the oceans.

• explore (v)

1.150 inquiry (n)

official investigation

επίσημη έρευνα

The police are holding an **inquiry** about the rise in burglaries.

• inquire (v)

1.151 research (n)

work that aims to find out facts

έρευνα

Before you start your assignment, you should do some **research** online to get more information.

people's opinion of you

φήμη

She has a **reputation** of being very clever because she always does well in exams.

1.153 collapse (v)

fall over

καταρρέω

The building was badly made and **collapsed** in the earthquake.

• collapse (n)

hurt, affect badly

βλάβω, καταστρέφω, προκαλώ ζημιά

The scandal about his marriage **damaged** his reputation as a family man.
