- 1.1 **campus** /'kæmpəs/ (n) land and buildings that belong to a college or university: πανεπιστημιούπολη, εγκαταστάσεις (πανεπιστημίου / κολεγίου)
Most first-year students live on the college campus.
- 1.2 **admissions office** place at a college or university that deals with accepting students: γραμματεία όπου γίνονται μόνο εγγραφές σπουδαστών (σε πανεπιστήμιο)
Send your completed forms to the college admissions office.
- 3 **dorm room** room in a building on a college campus where students live: δωμάτιο (σε φοιτητική εστία)

Denise often meets friends at the student center in between classes.
- 6 **fill (out)** /fɪl/ (v) write or enter information in the spaces provided on a form: συμπληρώνω (έντυπο, αίτηση κ.λπ.)
This form is complicated, so I need help filling it out.
- 7 **application** /æplɪ'keɪʃn/ (n) form used to make a request: αίτηση
Kay has started filling out college applications.
Der: **applicant** (n): αιτών, υποψήφιος
- 8 **register** /'redʒɪstər/ (v) put information about someone, especially a name, on an official list: εγγράφομαι
Jeff has just registered for a photography class.
Der: **registration** (n)
- course** /kɔ:rs/ (n) series of lessons about a subject: μάθημα, θεματική ενότητα (σε πανεπιστήμιο ή κολλέγιο)
Paul is taking a cooking course.
- 1 **take notes** write down some words quickly to help you remember things: κρατάω σημειώσεις
At university, students usually take notes during lectures.
- meet a deadline** do what is required by a certain date: τηρώ μια προθεσμία
Haley had to work late last week to meet a deadline.
- consider** /kən'sɪdər/ (v) think of someone or something in a particular way: θεωρώ
Plato is considered one of the most important thinkers of all time.
