Special Terms Governing the Examinations

1. In order to register the student in the list of candidates, from which those who will compete for the scholarships of the International School of Athens 2026-2027 will be shortlisted, the following supporting documents are required (*all documents can either be delivered in person to ISA, or alternatively sent by post, fax, or email by Friday, March 13th, 2026, except for the original letters of recommendation that must either be delivered in person or sent by post*):
 - 1.1. The present Scholarship Application Form, duly completed and signed.
 - 1.2. At least two (2) Letters of Recommendation (bearing the official School Stamp and enclosed in a sealed envelope) prepared by teachers who are teachers of the applicant in Grade 10.
 - 1.3. School Transcripts for Grades 7, 8 and 9.
 - 1.4. School Transcript attesting the final grades in the first term of Grade 10.
 - 1.5. Copies of Language Certificates, if applicable.
 - 1.6. Copies attesting to other Records of Achievement (e.g. in sports, the arts, awards in competitions etc.)
 - 1.7. Copy of the applicant's Identification Document or Passport.
2. The selection process followed in shortlisting students to take part in the examination for the IB Scholarship Awards will take into consideration all information provided in the applicant's dossier (namely grades, Letters of Recommendation etc.)
3. All students will be notified of whether they have been successful in being shortlisted to sit the Examination or if their application will not be taken forward.
4. On the day of the Exam, each applicant must bring an official document attesting to his/her identity, such as their ID Card or passport or other official document recognized as the equivalent of an ID Card.
5. The assessment for the Award of the two (2) Scholarships will take place through written examinations.
6. The school subjects that applicants will be examined in are:
 - 6.1. English
 - 6.2. Mathematics
7. Exam candidates will have to arrive at the premises of the International School of Athens, Artemidos 42 & Xenias Street, Kifissia 14562 (Tel.: +30 210-623-3888) on March 14th, arrival time 09:30 am:
 - 7.1. On Saturday, March 14th 2026 for the written examination in Mathematics (10:00-11:30).
 - 7.2. On Saturday, March 14th 2026 for the written examination in English (12:00-13:30).
8. The syllabus in which candidates will be examined includes all the material that has been covered in previous academic years in Junior High (Grades 7, 8 & 9 of secondary school), as well as 3/4 of the syllabus of the current academic year students are enrolled in (Grade 10 / 1st Grade of Lykeion). The syllabus examined is solely applicable to Mathematics. The material on which candidates will be assessed in Mathematics pertains to the syllabus taught in middle school (Grades 7-9) and the curriculum covered during the current academic year in Grade 10. A more detailed list of the topics will be provided upon request. The English examination tests applicants' linguistic competence, so there is no specific syllabus.
9. Parents or relatives accompanying the applicants will be allowed to remain on school grounds, but not within the vicinity of the examination room.
10. Exam candidates will have to bring with them pencils or pens. All examinations will have to be answered in blue or black ink. Writing in pencil is allowed only for draft notes.
11. During the written examinations, exam candidates are prohibited from having with them mobile phones, laptops, or any electronic, portable or wearable electronic devices, cameras, and calculators. It is incumbent on candidates to hand these to their family members prior to their entrance into the examination room.
